



## Portaleco References



It is a good practice in science publications and serious publication to give credit to people providing information to other authors. However, adding too many references to text and presentations causes quite some inconvenience to readers. Therefore Portaleco proposes and implements the following practice: *References are provided on documents and presentations hand outs at the end. References on web pages are shown as direct links on web pages or added as a special "References" link on more complex pages.*

### Summary

In this document major references used on the Portaleco site and references used to create the content and some references providing background information are listed.

### References to the Portaleco Site

All links shown in the left hand navigation bar and referenced feeds will be intentionally maintained over the life of the portaleco site. This will allow external links from other sites and use of clipping portlets in portals. Usage within portals is encouraged to demonstrate the power of portals to build customized portal pages for specific user groups.

### Portaleco Documents and RSS Feeds

Documents and RSS feeds will be referenced on several pages. A history page contains a document with references to all presentations and papers used on the site.
